Saathi Teachers Programme (STP) is a core programme run by Helambu Education and Livelihood Partnership (HELP) aaimed at strengthening the primary-level quality of education in rural Nepal. Saathi Teachers Programme believes that the teachers should be friendlier with their learners in order to create a trusting and effective an learning environment.

The programme is run in direct partnership with the local governments and receives funding mainly from Mondo Foundation, UK as well as a partial support from Interhands and ITA.

Saathi teachers work closely with local the School Management Committee and the local teachers, an instrumental combination of forces to transform the classrooms. A Saathi teacher is a passionate teacher committed to improving students' mathematical and literacy skills and focusing on developing 21st century skills in the primary classroom in a child-friendly way through extracurricular various activities, the arts, and culture. Saathi teachers will aid in the development of the 4Cs (Creativity, Critical thinking, Communication, and Collaboration) of the 21st century among students.

HELP works in mutual collaboration with the local government and the schools to manage this programme and assist the overall growth of the students. Currently, we have 26 Saathis working in three different Municipalities: Panchpokhari Thangpal Rural Municipality (Sindhupalchowk), Tripurasundari Rural Municipality (Sindhupalchowk), and Abukhaireni Municipality (Tanahun).

Annual Review Meeting at Panchpokhari Thangpal RM

This quarter started with the annual Panchpokhari review meeting at Thangpal Rural Municipality which was an opportunity for us to reflect on the progress of the last year and plan this year. The Teacher for Development Coordinator for Thangpal Panchpokhari Cluster-Amulya Shrestha and the Programme Coordinator for Saathi Teachers Programme-Sadhana Shrestha participated in the review meeting with the stakeholders from the rural municipality, the Ward Chairs, the School Management Committee and the Principals. The Heads Chairperson and the Head of the Education Department from the Rural Municipality helped the stakeholders from school-SMC Heads and the Principals to reflect on the work of our Saathi teachers and encouraged them constructive to provide feedback.

The STP representatives also shared their reflection and emphasized the importance of continued collaboration between the rural municipality, school stakeholders, and the Saathi teachers to ensure that the program continues to meet the educational needs of the community.



First Quarterly Training of the Year!

We have successfully completed the first quarterly training of the year, which took place from July 12-14, 2024 at GAN Research and Learning Centre, Karyabinayak, Lalitpur. This meetup brought together our 3rd, 4th and 5th cohort, who came together for a 3-days residential training, which centered around reflecting on our collective Saathi journey, strengthening our practices and growing our leadership. It was an amazing space to connect with each other, share insights and build our community.

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theme of this training was The centered around strengthening team well-being building and among Saathi teachers by reflecting on addressing collective journeys, classroom challenges, celebrating achievements, enhancing teaching practices, promoting self-awareness and professional growth, and starting Community Action Projects that we have introduced from this year.

Over the three days, Saathi Teachers engaged in meaningful reflection on their collective journey, addressed classroom challenges, and celebrated their achievements. The sessions were designed to foster professional growth, with an emphasis on understanding students, enhancing teaching methods, and strengthening communication skills.

The Community Action Project session provided a platform for teachers to lead grassroots initiatives, reinforcing their roles as leaders in fostering positive change within their communities.

Second Support Visit and Classroom Observation in Tripurasundari RM

After the quarterly training and the monsoon break, our Saathi teachers are back in their schools. With the first terminal examination coming up, our Saathis are preparing their students for the examination with revision classes and providing extra support.



Our Teachers Development Coordinator (TDC) for Tripurasundari RM, Aruna Shrestha Karki has completed her second support visit and classroom observation recently. The visit was centered around well-being, community engagement, and supporting our Saathi teachers in their classroom practices. After classroom observation of each Saathi teacher, she also provided personalized feedback and facilitated discussions on enhancing student engagement and fostering a positive learning environment. She will now be working on preparing for their second Tune Up Build Up (TUBU) meeting, where the challenges from classroom observation will be addressed and the cluster will come together to share their practices, resources and support each other.

Similarly, our other TDCs are also planning and preparing for their second support visit.

Saathi Teachers Sanjita and Sunita conducting their first Community Action Project !

Sanjita Shrestha and Sunita Sherchan, fourth cohort Saathi teachers of Shree Chandrodaya Basic School, Aanbookhaireni-1, Samastipur, are going to conduct the first Community Action Project this September. Community Action Projects are small scale projects led by our Saathi teachers to address grassroots issues, fostering practical solutions, ownership, and responsibility, and driving sustainable, positive change in rural communities. These projects involve Saathi teachers identifying and addressing critical issues within the communities they serve. These are introduced from this academic year and are designed to empower the educators to become active change-makers in rural communities.



Sanjita and Sunita's Community Action Project is titled 'Parenting Education' and they intend to conduct a workshop for the parents with the goal of helping the parents to know about their children's behavior and to help the parents know of the ways of supporting in their children's learning. They have sought the help of Ms. Anita Kafle, an Early Childhood Development Specialist, to facilitate the session.

Our Saathi teachers of Aarambha cluster, Aanbookhaireni have completed their first community work together. The cluster came together at Shres Shree Chandidevi Basic School, Purlung, Aanbookhaireni-6, and decorated the classrooms with paintings and educational artwork to create a lively spae for the students.



Our Saathi Teachers, Bishal Ale Magar and Jaya Baidhakota placed at Shree Chandidevi Basic School, Aanbookhaireni-6, Purlung, organized a Dengue Awareness Programme on August 16 as two schools in the Rural Municipality were closed due to its spread and they also noticed that some of their students were also not attending schools for some days due to fever and body aches.
